

The following projects were chosen from among 120 applicants for funding:

- **Port Townsend Paper Corp**, Jefferson County – \$2 million grant for a biomass cogeneration plant that will generate energy from solid organic fuels such as wood waste and logging debris. Will support 290 permanent and 108 temporary jobs, and leverages \$53 million in additional funding.
- **Cedar Grove Composting**, King County. \$1 million grant for food and yard waste anaerobic digestion. 4 permanent jobs and 24 temporary jobs. Leverages \$8 million in additional funding. Largest single dedicated yard waste composting facility in the US
- **General Biodiesel**, King County - \$1 million loan for general plant expansion. 60 permanent and 9 temporary jobs. Leverages \$10 million additional funding.
- **Renewal Energy Composite Solutions, LLC**, Clark County - \$1 million grant to switch a portion of a boat manufacturing plant to small wind turbine production. 101 permanent and 99 temporary jobs. Leverages \$5 million additional funding.
- **Barr-Tech, LLC**, Lincoln County - \$1.5 million loan and a \$500,000 grant for anaerobic digester to process local food waste. 117 permanent, 41 temporary jobs. Leverages \$9.7 million additional funding.
- **Green Energy Today, LLC**, Franklin County - \$898,000 grant for Columbia Basin Renewable Energy project using an irrigation canal for hydropower. 33 permanent, 14 temporary jobs. Leverages \$3.5 million additional funding.
- **Farm Power Lynden**, LLC, Skagit County - \$1,063,000 grant for manure digester to produce electricity and excess hot water for use in on-site greenhouse. 24 permanent, 44 temporary jobs and leverages \$3.5 million additional funding.
- **GR Silicate Nanofibers and Carbonates**, King County - \$1.4 million loan for use of nanomaterials to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by capturing Co2 gas from Grays Harbor Paper flue gas and converting to calcium carbonate for use in paper. 15 permanent and 280 temporary jobs, leverages \$5 million additional funds.
- **Seafreeze, Inc**, King County - \$561,862 loan for energy efficiency upgrades to a cold storage facility. 3 temporary jobs. Leverages \$1.1 million additional funding.
- **Moses Lake Biorefinery, LLC**, Grant County - \$1 million for a cellulosic ethanol project. 13 permanent, 7 temporary jobs. Leverages \$9 million additional funding.
- **NCS Power, Inc.**, Clark County - \$2 million loan to relocate LED manufacturing. 290 permanent, 90 temporary jobs. Leverages \$6.9 million additional funding.
- **Venoil, LLC**, Skagit County - \$500,000 loan for biorefinery at Anacortes. 18 permanent, 19 temporary and leverages \$900,000 additional funding.

- **Rappaport Energy Consulting, LLC**, Cowlitz County - \$1.5 million loan for Longview biofuels refinery and co-generation facility generating power from urban recycling and other sources. 20 permanent and 50 temporary and leverages \$6 million additional funding.
- **Evergreen Fuel Technologies Inc.**, Benton County - \$1 million loan for converting agricultural crop waste to clean electricity through gasification. 3 permanent, 6 temporary jobs and leverages \$2 million additional funding.
- **Sirti Foundation**, Spokane County - \$250,000 loan for clean technology growth funding. 186 permanent, 106 temporary jobs and leverages \$2 million additional funding.
- **MacDonald-Miller Facility Solutions**, King County - \$1.5 million loan for Seattle Steam Company utility-based energy efficiency project development and finance program. 6 permanent, 22 temporary jobs and leverages \$12 million additional funding.
- **City of Federal Way**, King County - \$223,000 loan for City Hall energy efficiency project. 1 permanent, 10 temporary jobs. Leverages \$323,000 additional funds.
- **Washington State Parks and Rec Commission**, Jefferson County - \$250,000 loan for energy efficiency project at Fort Worden State Park historical buildings. 2 temporary jobs, leverages \$250,000 additional funding.
- **City of Spokane**, Spokane County - \$850,000 loan for City of Spokane energy stimulus project. 33 temporary jobs, leverages \$3.5 million additional funding.
