



Number of admissions for inpatient competency evaluations within 7 days from receipt of order







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




Risk Indicators and Coverage Status for Persons Referred for Competency Evaluation

Number of Competency Evaluation referrals with . . .




Risk Indicators and Coverage Status for Persons Referred for Competency Restoration








Number of Misdemeanor and Felony Competency Evaluation Referrals by County






RATIO OF MISDEMEANORS TO FELONIES, JANUARY – JUNE 2017





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
Percent Change in Competency Evaluation Referrals




Number of Misdemeanor and Felony Restoration Referrals by County





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

Factors Considered

- State Population: increased 5%
- Arrests: Total number unchanged; rate decreased
- Medicaid Expansion: impact since January 2014
 - Increased number with medical coverage
 - Increased number with documented Mental Illness and/or Substance Use Disorders
- Legal System Changes: Trueblood decision March 2015
- Increased Capacity (facilities and staffing): build it and

Systems Considerations

Inter-agency issues

- Health (HCA) now integrating with Behavioral Health July 2018
 - Other Social Services remain in DSHS

Collaboration between state/ local partners

- County variation in use of Competency Evaluation & Restoration
- Arrests/ Charges are a local decision

Multiple system issues involved

- Community Services and/or diversion prior to (instead of) criminal justice involvement
- Coordinated care across all systems
