
Washington State's Educational Attainment Goals










Washington population ages 25-44

- Employers need a highly skilled workforce to remain competitive. In the next 5 years, over 70 percent of jobs in our state will require a credential or degree.
- Our residents are not earning the needed credentials. Currently, only 56 percent of Washingtonians ages 25–44 have finished an education or training program after high school
- Employers find talent elsewhere and our residents are not competitive for living-wage jobs. WA ranks 4th for in-migration of workers at all training levels.




Equity is Paramount to Reaching the State's Goals






